As you leave the Tourism office, you will find a huge monument on the left, the Aqueduct. Do you know for what purpose and when (in which century) it was built? Maybe you will find more information on the city map we gave to your parents.

Walking up Cervantes Street you will pass by the House of Peaks (Casa de los Picos) and a bit further to the left, there is a small square called Platero Oquendo. Find the writing on the corner and fill in the gaps:

Prohibido aparcar.....bajo multa de.....


Have you seen the facade of this house? There are many houses in Segovia with this kind of decoration.

Before arriving to the Main Square (Plaza Mayor), you will find the Corpus Square. On the left, a door leads to the old synagogue of the Jewish community that lived in Segovia. Could you tell us for what purpose is this building used nowadays?
